STATES ITS PURPOSE**

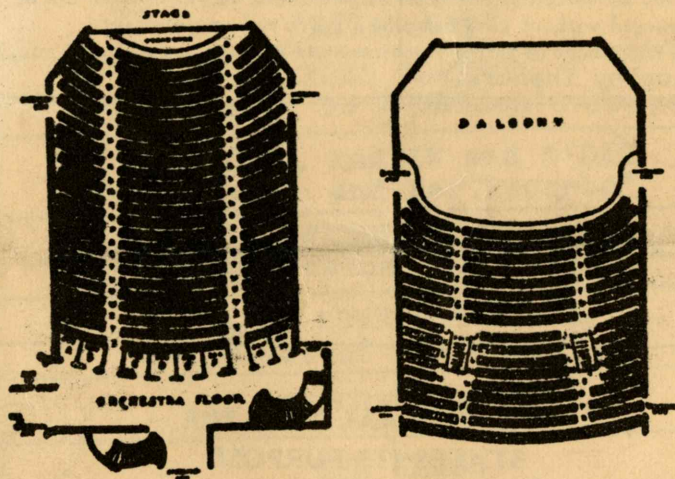
The Federal Theatre starts with the objective of employing theatre people in the profession for which they have been trained.

The far-reaching purpose is to establish theatres so vital to community life that they will continue to function after the Federal program is completed.

FEDERAL THEATRE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Federal Theatre during the past eight months presented a total of 2,255 performances throughout the Commonwealth. These presentations include drama, marionettes and vaudeville.

Federal Theatre highlights during this period include the staging of the Sinclair Lewis-Federal Theatre-dramatization of "It Can't Happen Here," "Chalk Dust," "Russet Mantle," "Class of '29," "The Campus Widow," "Black and White Revue," and the Marionette production of Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol."
