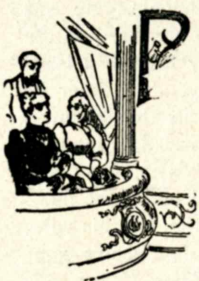

PERSONAL ABOUT WILFRED CLARKE WHO APPEARS HERE IN "WHAT WILL HAPPEN NEXT?"

Wilfred Clarke, comedian of rare talent, comes from the bluest of the blue-blooded stage aristocracy. His mother, Mrs. John S. Clarke, was a sister of the eminent tragedian, Edwin Booth; and his father, John Sleeper Clarke, was one of the most famous comedians of his day. Wilfred Clarke was born in Philadelphia. He was educated in England and France. He first appeared on the stage in London in 1885, and subsequently became a leading member of Barry Sullivan's company. Still later he joined his uncle and Lawrence Barrett in this country, playing in many Shakespearian productions. Still later he was with Julia Marlowe and Augustin Daly's company, and for a period of three years he was starred under the management of John T. Ford. Later Mr. Clarke, and his wife, Theo. Carew, were leading members of Ada Rehan's company. Although Wilfred Clarke and Miss Carew appeared here on former occasions, it is claimed that their present offering, "What Will Happen Next?" is so cleverly constructed that both are given an equal chance to convince the particular clientele of this theatre that they are among the cleverest people that ever came to vaudeville from the field of classic drama.

THE ERNEST PANTZER & CO.

Ernest Pantzer, of the famous European Pantzer Family, will be here during the week of June 19 with his company in a Parisian Aero-Pantomine novelty. Pantzer might be termed a "Beau Brummel Acrobat." Although faultlessly attired and suggesting the "Matinee Idol," he is really a marvel of strength and agility, and with his assistants, he does some acrobatic stunts that are almost beyond credulity until they have been seen. For instance, one of his tricks that is performed with Midget Charley, the smallest acrobat on the stage, consists of a hand balance with Charley's body stretched full out in a horizontal position and balanced by one (only) of Mr. Pantzer's hands, his arm outstretched to its full length in a straight line from the shoulder. This is one of the wonderful things they do, nor does it give an inkling of the rapid-fire fun with which the act abounds. Mr. Pantzer is a brother of Willy Pantzer, the acrobat who has appeared here in previous seasons, and also of Lina Pantzer, the beautiful trapezist. Another sister, a remarkable contortionist, has also appeared here, but this is Ernest's first appearance here at the head of an organization.

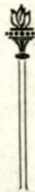

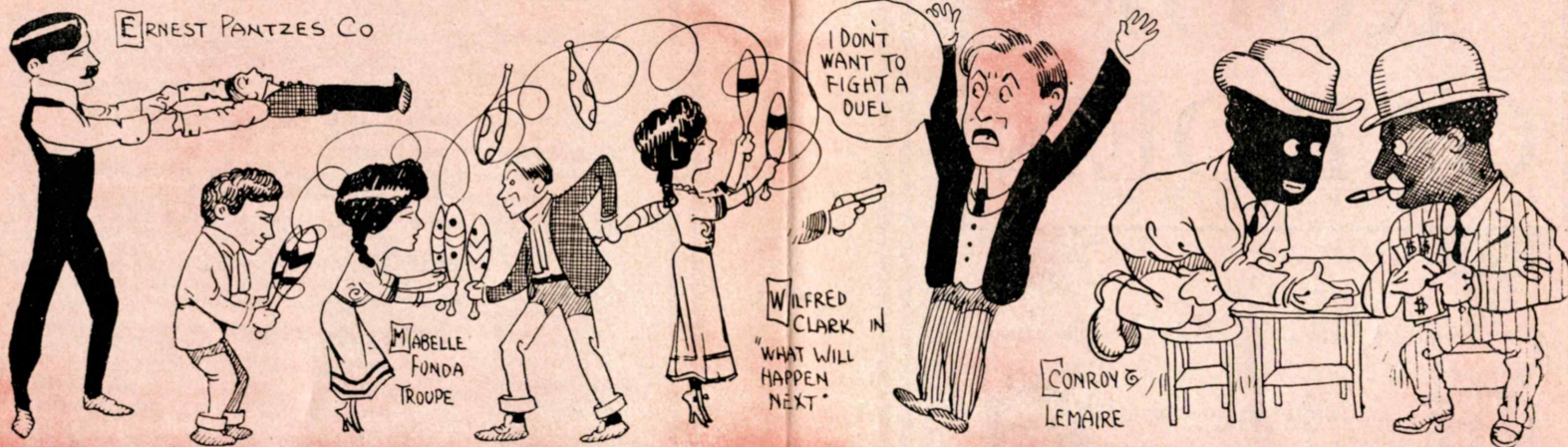

This trio describe their offering neatly in the single program line, "A happy combination of mirth and music." They have one of the very few sketches in vaudeville in which there is laughable comedy, excellent singing and not enough "sketch" to interfere with the complete enjoyment of delightful specialty material. Later Miss Warren has another song, and near the finale Lyon makes his appearance, good for another storm of laughter, and is greeted by the mistress of the house. He plays on the piano, and the finish is a song and dance. The trio score one of the most undoubted hits in vaudeville. This is one of the very best of the newer acts on the circuit and will surely score strong with us during the week of June 5th.

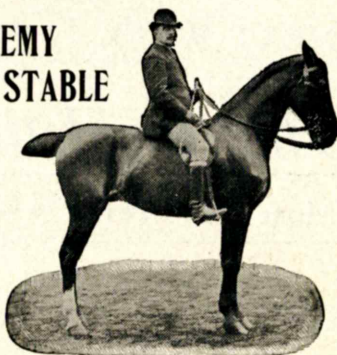

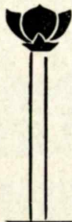

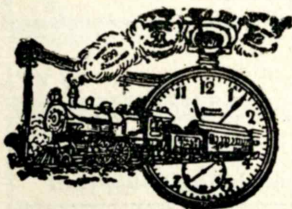
